Save the dates! We'd love to see you there.

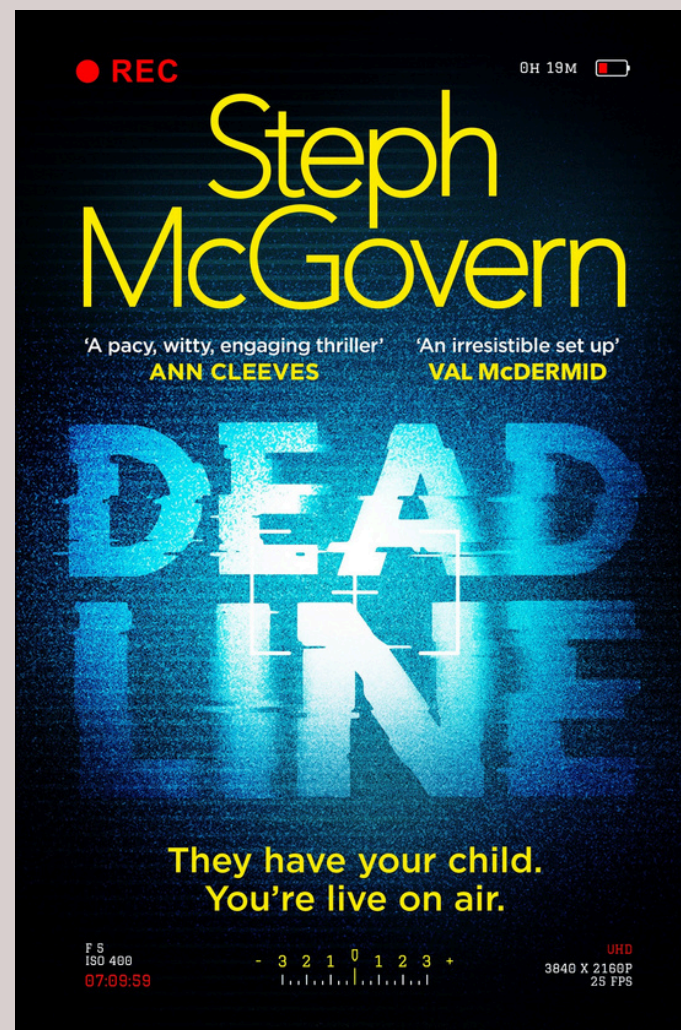

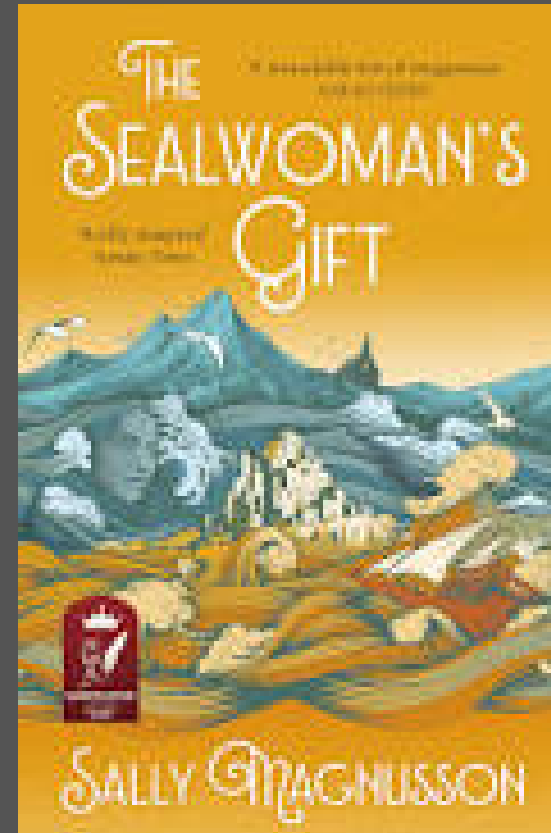

"I'm looking forward to being at Morpeth very much. I'll be talking about The Shapeshifter's Daughter. it's my fourth novel and one that stems directly from tales that my father, Magnus Magnusson, used to tell me about the Norse myths from his northern homeland of Iceland. In this novel some of the old stories about the gods and goddesses of Asgard - Odin, Thor, Loki and especially Hel, queen of the underworld, are mingled with the experiences of characters in modern Orkney, especially those of Helen Firth, who has returned to the islands after many years in England to learn how to die. 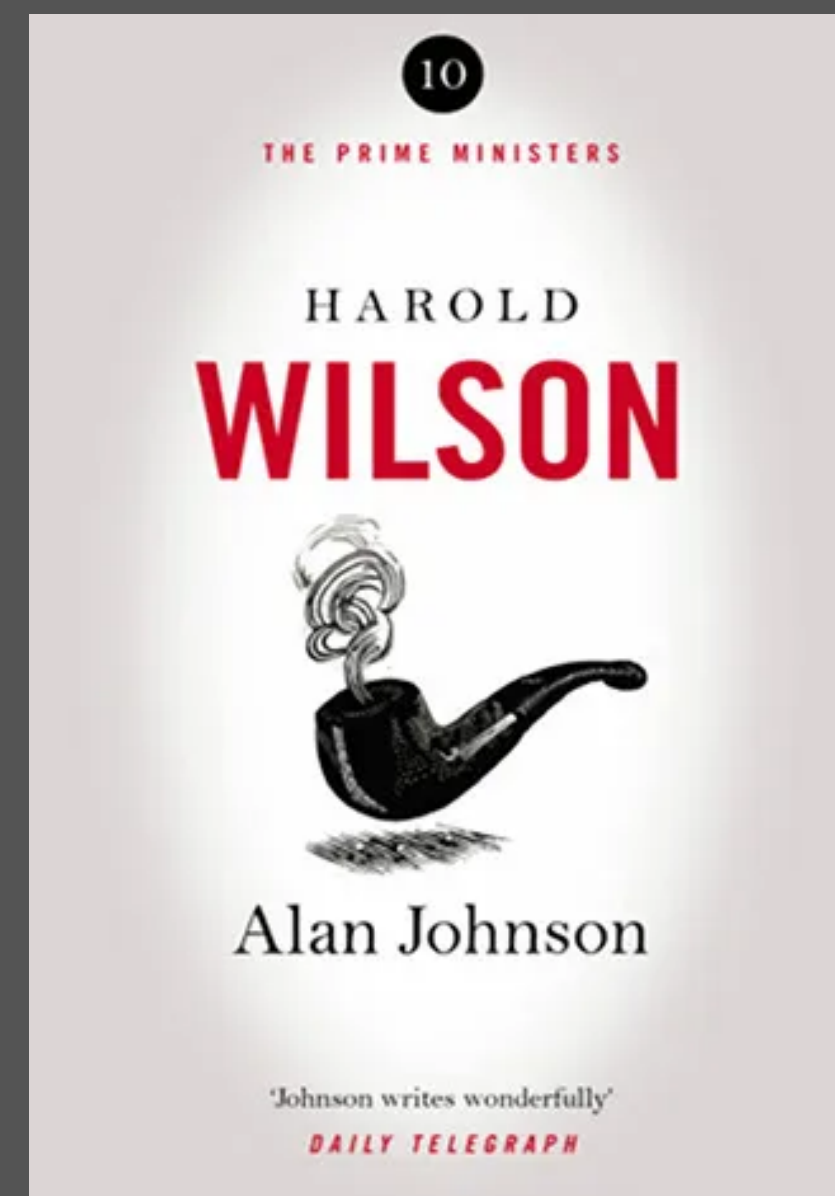

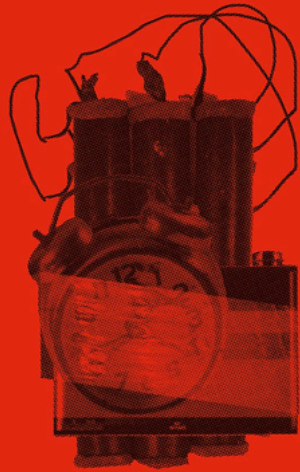

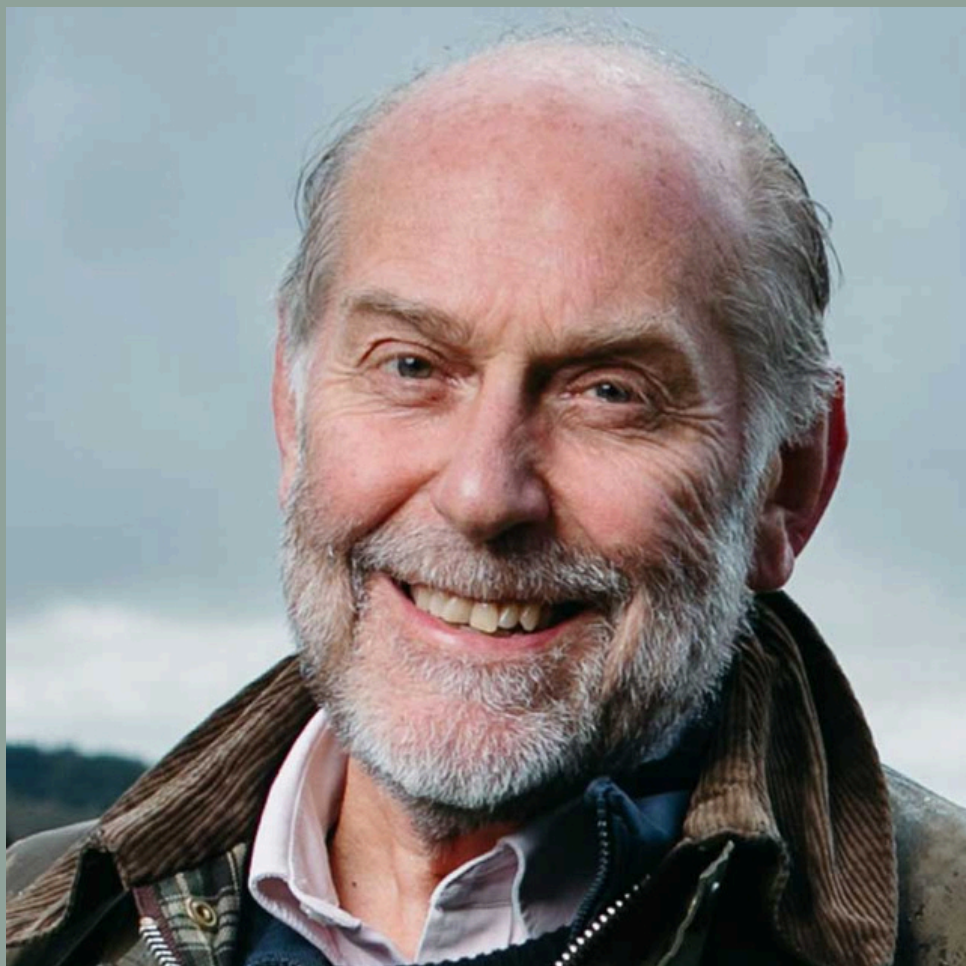

for more than 20 years, justice campaigner, renowned diarist and novelist Chris Mullin.

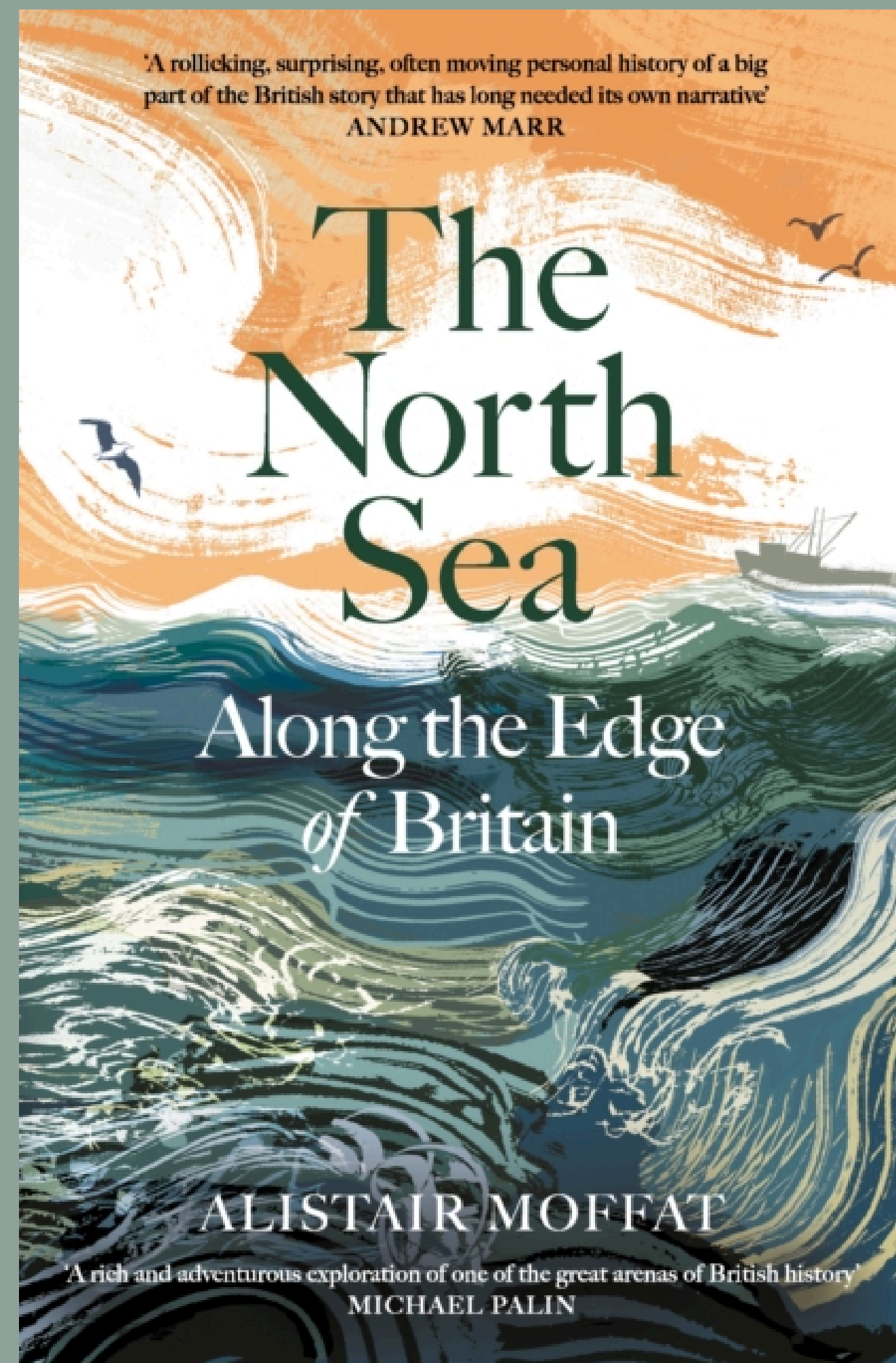

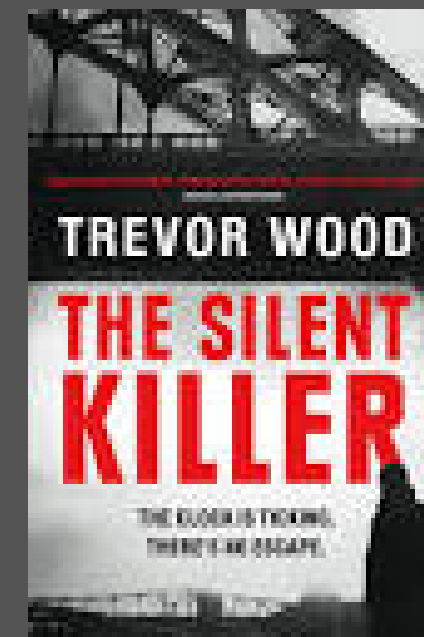
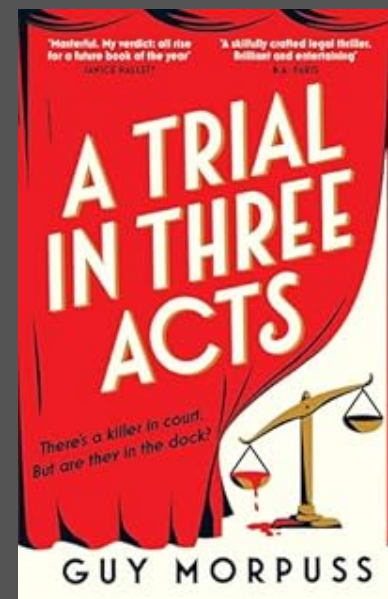

Moffat takes us on an epic, sweeping history from the white cliffs of Dover to flooded homes, crossing wild fenland and Brexit fault lines, visiting well-worn seaside towns and windswept island monasteries. The story he tells is one of newcomers and the mark they left, of Roman invasions, the arrival of the Saxons and the Viking raids. But it is also a story of those they met, of Pictish citadels and Orcadian stone circles. It is a story of technological advancement, of submarine engineering and weather forecasting. It is a story of huge industry, from whaling expeditions and fishing trawlers to the boom of North Sea oil and offshore wind farms. This is the story of how the North Sea shaped us and will continue to do so; it is above all a story of insistent, inescapable change.

A trio of authors all making a return visit to Morpeth Book Festival, will join forces to answer audience questions about crime writing and their own work. Trevor Wood is an award-winning writer of gritty crime novels set in the North East. His debut novel collected a clutch of awards as well as being shortlisted as a crime novel of the year. His latest series of books featuring DCI Jack Parker, has been optioned for television. His book A Trial in Three Acts by barrister turned novelist Guy Morpuss KC, combined nail-biting courtroom drama with a Christie-esque locked room murder mystery in a page-turning legal thriller.

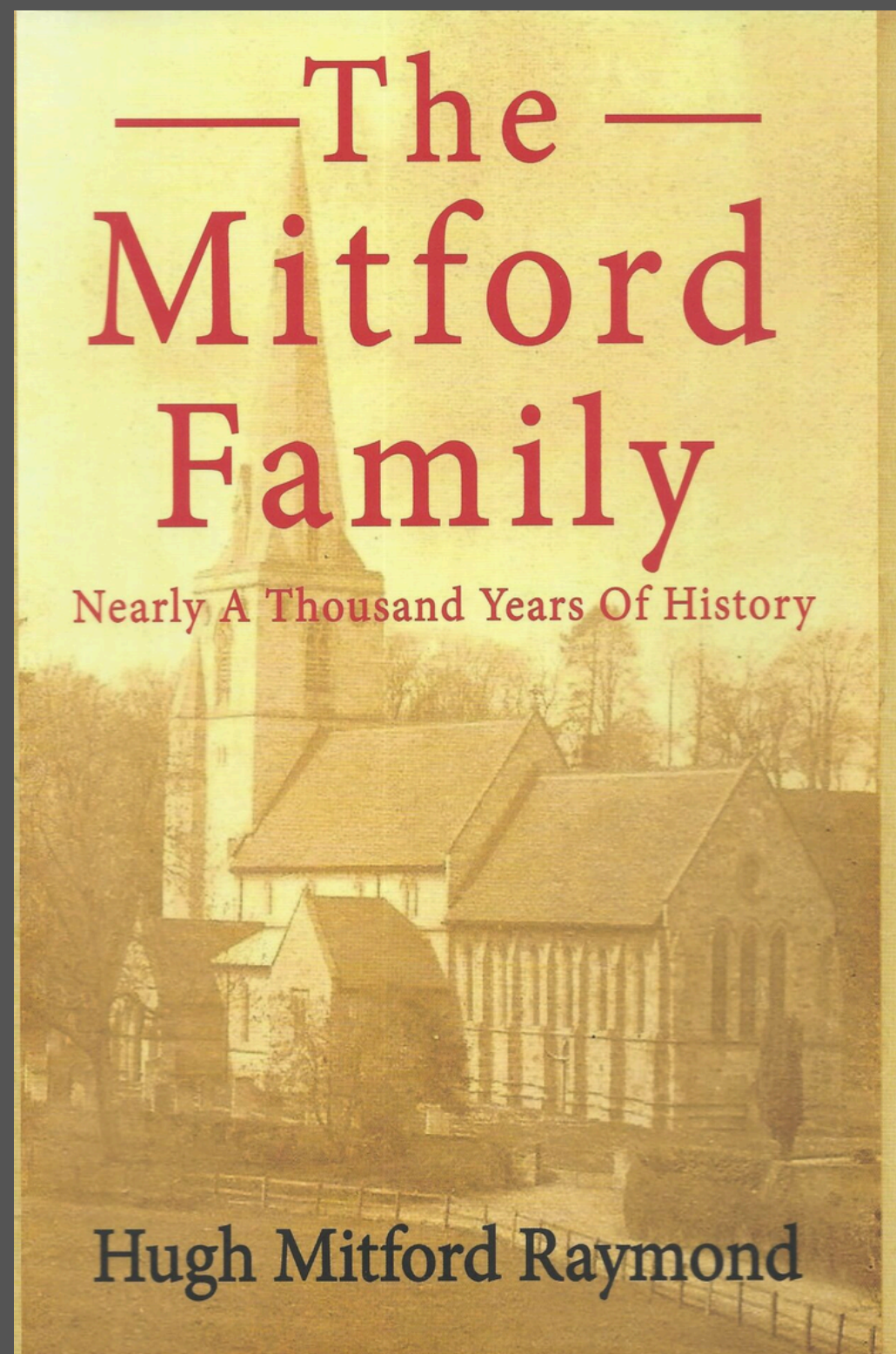

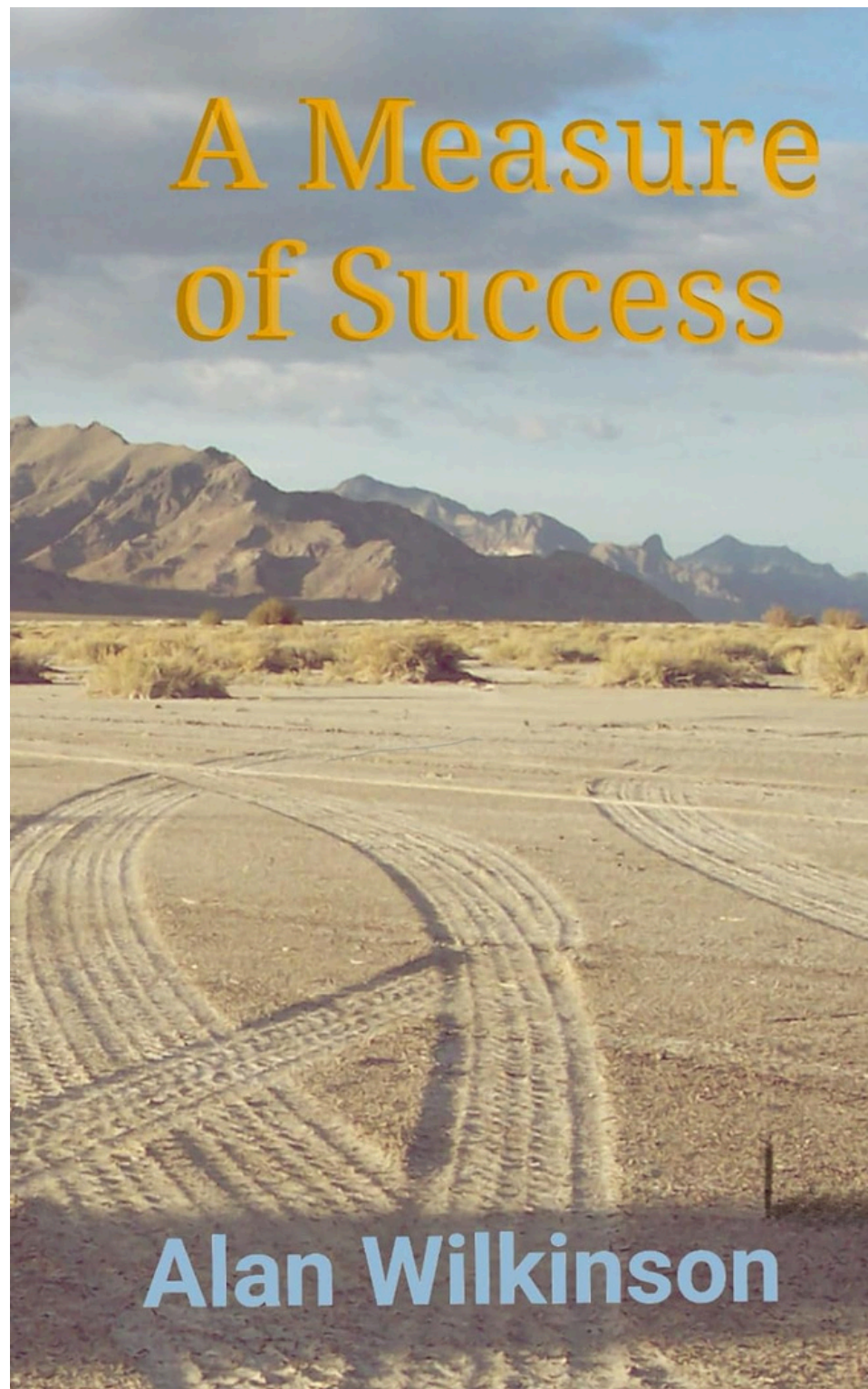
A Thousand Years of Family History

For nearly a thousand years the Mitfords were one of England's most extraordinary families, overseeing the running of the estate on the outskirts of Morpeth. They built the now demolished Mitford Castle, the church and the hall and over the generations they became landowners and philanthropists, writers and historians, activists and controversially fascists with some of the notorious 'Mitford Sisters', becoming friends with Hitler, a famous author and a Duchess! 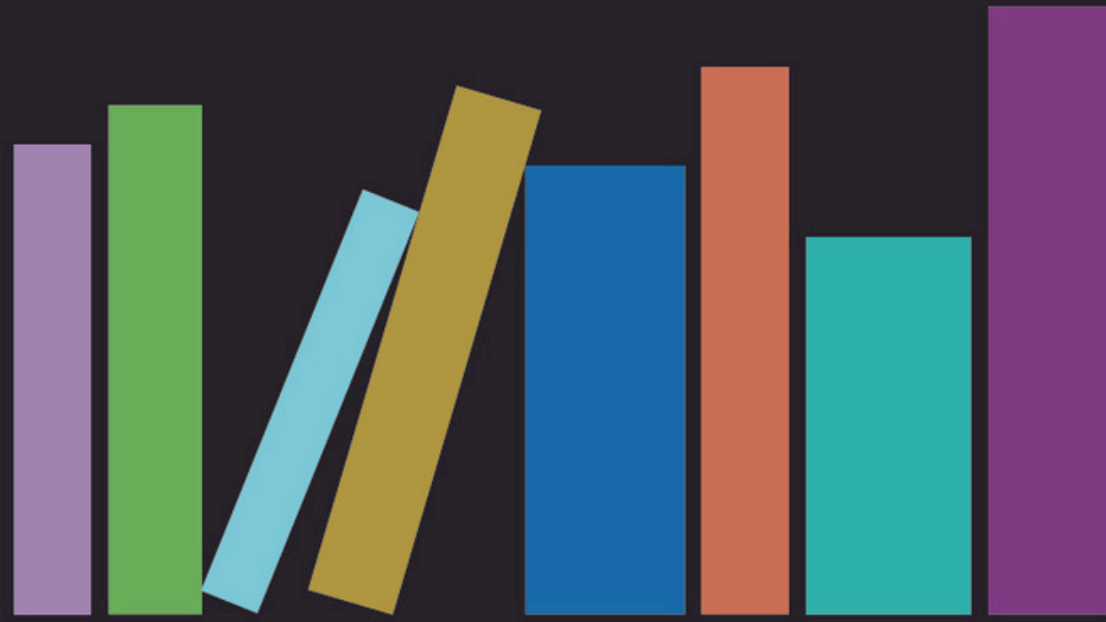
Once Upon A Toon
